



If passed by voters on May 15, 2018 the proposed \$619.7 million bond would increase the current property tax levy rate by an estimated \$1.24 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. If the bond does not pass, the additional tax would not be levied and the listed projects would not be completed. The Community Facilities Task Force reviewed all funding methods available to the district and recommended the School Board place a general obligation bond on the ballot for voters to consider. The district would receive an \$8,000,000 grant from the state if bonds are passed.

Keizer Elementary School

Keizer Elementary School is a single-story facility constructed in 1985. The facility was designed without a cafeteria or a full-sized school kitchen. The building was designed for 596 students and is currently serving 736 students. The identified expansion projects would add a new cafeteria, kitchen, multipurpose fitness room, and four (4) classrooms, expanding the classroom/core capacity of the building to meet projected student enrollment through 2025. The identified building improvement projects would include plumbing improvements and replacement of partition walls. Technology and communications improvements would include expanded wireless capacity and intercom system upgrades. Bond funds would also be used to make changes to the visibility of the front entry from the office and update the electronic badge access system.
