



If passed by voters on May 15, 2018 the proposed \$619.7 million bond would increase the current property tax levy rate by an estimated \$1.24 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. If the bond does not pass, the additional tax would not be levied and the listed projects would not be completed. The Community Facilities Task Force reviewed all funding methods available to the district and recommended the School Board place a general obligation bond on the ballot for voters to consider. The district would receive an \$8,000,000 grant from the state if bonds are passed.

## Scott Elementary School

Scott Elementary School is a single-story facility constructed in 1976. The facility was designed without a cafeteria or a full-sized school kitchen. Nine (9) portable classrooms were added to address previous enrollment growth. Stable enrollment is projected through 2025 and beyond. The identified expansion projects would add a cafeteria, kitchen, multipurpose fitness room, and 10 classrooms, expanding the classroom/core capacity of the main building to meet projected student enrollment through 2025. Building projects would include plumbing and HVAC improvements. Technology and communications improvements would provide expanded wireless capacity and intercom system upgrades. Bond funds would also be used to provide updated electronic badge access to exterior doors.
